Peace and good!

In Chapter XII of the *Vita Prima (First Life of Saint Francis)*, Thomas Celano reports that when the fraternity increased to eight, "the blessed Francis called them to himself and told them many things about the kingdom of God, contempt for the world, denial of their own will, and subjection of the body" (1C 29). He then sent them into the world to announce peace, to preach penance, and to be patient in trials. The Saint closed the meeting by challenging the brothers with these words: "Cast your care upon the Lord, and he will sustain you" (1C 29). The account continues:

Only a short time had passed when Saint Francis began desiring to see them all. He prayed to the Lord, who gathers the dispersed of Israel, mercifully to bring them together soon. So it happened in a short time: they came together at the same time according to his desire, without any human summons, giving thanks to God. Coming together in one place, they celebrate with great joy on seeing their devoted shepherd, and are amazed that the same desire to come together moved all of them in this way. They report the good things which the merciful Lord was doing for them, and if they had been somewhat negligent and ungrateful, they humbly ask and carefully accept correction from the Holy Father. (1C 30)

As I shared in last week's bulletin column, Francis of Assisi recognized that a gathering of the friars was a privileged place for himself and each friar. In particular these were times that the essential elements of their fraternal life could be discussed in light of God's eternal will and pleasure.

As we return from our Provincial Chapter of the Whole in Loretto, PA, the Lord has blessed us with time for prayer, reflection, discussion, election of our new Provincial Council, and sharing as brothers.

On behalf of the friars, I thank you for your prayers this past week as we gathered in Loretto to reflect upon and celebrate our lives as friars.

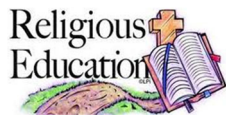
